**VOLUNTEERS ARE NEEDED ON OCTOBER 21<sup>ST</sup> to help prepare the site for the new flagpole placement.**

The new flagpole will be placed in front of the Church House where the small garden and rose bush is. The plan is to dig up the small garden and move the rosebush closer to the house. A hole will then be dug to accommodate the new flagpole and 3 tier-platform. Since we will be using concrete, we will need to wait 24 hours to assemble the entire flag pole.

We are dedicating this new flag pole as a memorial to all the men and women of this church and parish who have served and are

still serving our country. This dedication is tentatively scheduled for Saturday, November 11<sup>th</sup> at 11:00am. (Veteran's Day)

This will be a two year project starting with the flagpole site and placement. The 3 tier platform will be built in 2018 as we obtain grants and donations.

We were able to obtain a grant and a donation which enabled us to purchase the new flagpole and solar light. And we will thank the individual and group for their generosity at the dedication.

### **WE NEED YOUR HELP to make the Nut/Fruit Rolls and Pirohi**

The rolls and pirohi are big selling items in both our First Friday sales and our cookie sale. We need volunteers for both of these endeavors and would like you to schedule specific dates to help make these items. Lack of knowledge in how to make any of these is not an excuse to not volunteer, we will show you what to do; none of it is very difficult. Please contact the coordinators listed below, **these are both huge undertakings and we need YOUR help.**

**We will be baking nut, poppyseed and apricot rolls on the following Saturdays: Oct. 21, 28, Nov. 11 and Nov. 18.** We need a minimum 500 rolls for our Christmas sales.

**Each Saturday we need 11 people.** Most days it is the same 11 workers. Please volunteer to give these people a break because along with making rolls they are baking more than 40 dozen cookies each plus helping make pirohi, doing Sunday

bakes and other jobs necessary to make the Cookie Sale work.

Please know you do not need to know how to make the rolls. We have a system and will teach you how we do things. If baking is not your thing, we also need help packaging the finished product and there is lots of clean up.

We will be making the pirohi on the Thursdays and Fridays from now until the sale. **We need a minimum of 500 DOZEN pirohi.** We need 2 people to help make the fillings on Thursdays and 10 people on Fridays to make the pirohi, pinch, boil and package.

We ask that you notify Pat with specific date(s) that you will help so that she can have enough prepared for the number of people that will be there. For example, if six people volunteer for a Friday and thirteen show up, there is not enough for everyone to do and vice versa.

### Professors Parks' Ponderings

#### Liturgical Living:

Last time, I reflected on the peace we ask for during the litanies in our worship. Going from there, we see how the petitions in the litany become more focused. We pray for particular people such as the Pope and our Bishops); we also pray for our communities and those who serve them. We pray for our government and civil and military servants.

Now, I know everyone has their ideas about how government and civil society should work, and frankly, we have even stronger ideas about the things that DON'T work; but the fact is, we pray for those leading and serving the country—even those that we do not agree with.

As an aid to prepare for the Sunday Gospel, this bulletin segment will summarize the coming week's Gospel reading and show where to find it in the Bible so families can read the whole Gospel. We also are providing some discussion questions for families and friends to talk about together.

### Gospel Summary for Oct. 22, 2017: Luke 8:26-39

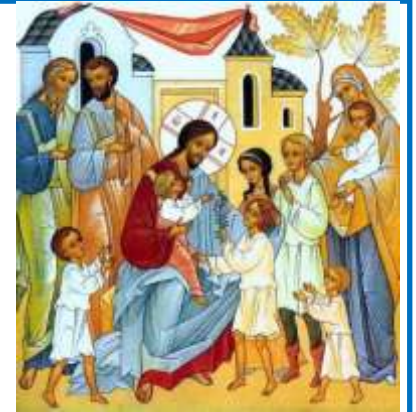

Jesus arrived in a town and was met by a man who acted very strangely. He had demons. He was not in his right mind. He didn't wear clothes, and lived in the caves. When he saw Jesus, the unclean spirits made him say, "What have I to do with you, Jesus?" Jesus asked, "What is your name?" The man answered "Legion."

Jesus commanded the legion, or army, of unclean spirits to leave the man and to enter the herd of pigs that were nearby. They did so, and then the herd rushed down a steep hill into the lake and all were drowned. The man was now healed. But the people of the area were afraid of Jesus, and asked that he leave. He got in the boat and left them. The man that was healed wanted to go with Jesus, but Jesus told him to return to his home, and to tell people what God had done for him.

#### Family Discussion Questions:

1. The man in the Gospel was very sick. He had demons that made him act strangely. Where did he live?
2. Jesus commanded the unclean spirits to get out of the man. Where did he tell them to go?
3. Did the unclean spirits do as Jesus told them to? What did the pigs do then?
4. The man that Jesus healed wanted to go with him. Jesus told him to do something else. What was it?
